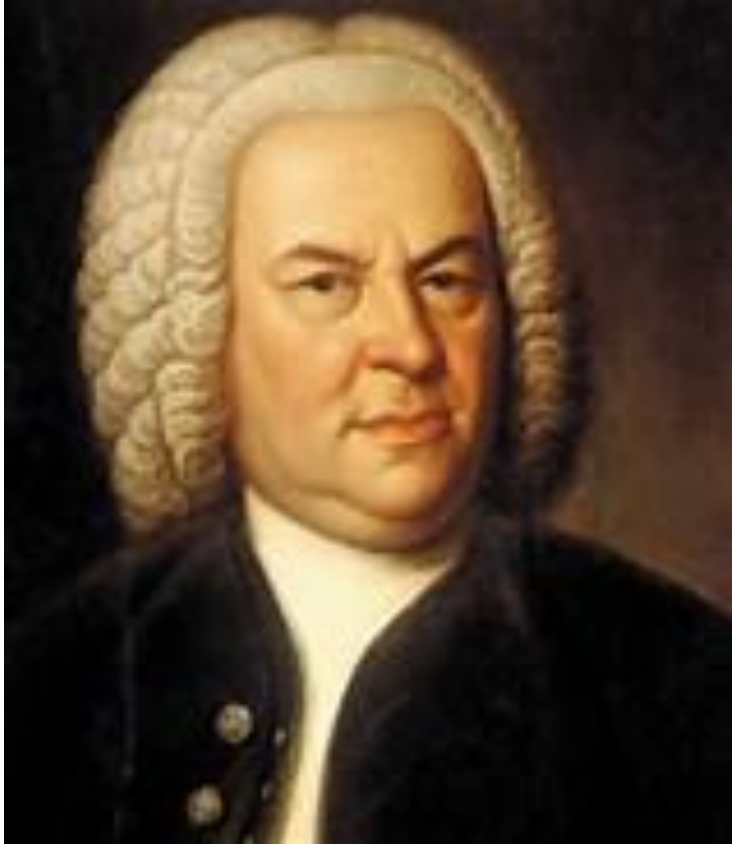

1. Who is the “Word?”

- Communication of God—revealing and relating God to man

2. What did he do?

- Became Flesh
- Dwelt Among Us.

3. What did they see?

- The unique GLORY of the “only Son from the Father.”
- The GLORY full of GRACE and TRUTH.

4. What did they receive?

- GRACE upon GRACE that flows from his FULLNESS.

5. How does this change us?

- A Mediator who is interceding. Romans 8:34, Hebrews 7:25, and Westminster Larger Catechism #55
- A mission given from God. John 20:21, “Jesus said to them again, ‘Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.’”
- A radical love for others who are different. 1 Corinthians 9:19-23, “I became . . . I became . . . I became . . . I have become.”

Q. How does Christ make Intercession?

A. Christ makes intercession, by his appearing in our nature continually before the Father in heaven, in the merit of his obedience and sacrifice on earth, declaring his will to have it applied to all believers; answering all accusations against them, and procuring for them quiet of conscience, notwithstanding daily failings, access with boldness to the throne of grace, and acceptance of their persons and services.”
